DELIVERY METHOD

Each class is primarily online with a weekend in-person experiential requirement where students provide animal-assisted services to community agencies

Summer, Fall or Spring

2-3 semesters (half-a-year)

9 credits

One of only two MSW programs in the nation to offer a specialized certificate in Animal-Assisted Social Work. Animal-Assisted services provide physical, psychological, and social benefits for those served by social workers.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The increased knowledge of the benefits of human-animal interaction has led to greater demand for skilled practitioners who can address the many psychosocial needs of children and adults utilizing animal-assisted interventions.

Through specialized instruction, students will be prepared to utilize therapy and crisis response dogs in their professional practice settings to enhance the functioning of those they serve.

The certificate courses can also be applied to the MSW degree if students later decide to complete the course requirements.
